

The photo above is the Hapii family who we are bringing to Akron in April as refugees and parolees from Ukraine. Sadly, the family has experienced the horrors of the ongoing war firsthand. We are a Welcome Circle; a group of parishioners from St. Francis de Sales, St. Paul's, and Holy Ghost parishes. Welcome Circles are authorized by the USCCB and the federal government.

As sponsors, our job is to provide housing, household furnishings, furniture, appliances, clothing, internet, food, transportation, household tools, legal aid, English lessons, driver's training, many types of orientation, find employment, and all basic needs of life. This is quite a list, and it will take some time, but our Welcome Circle is 100% committed to accomplishing all of it! Our goal is to have them self-sufficient within 12 months. The family is eager to work hard to accomplish this.

So far, we have accomplished the following: arranged housing, acquired a full inventory of household goods and furniture, bikes for the family, a washer and dryer, and have raised \$15,000.00. But to make this all happen successfully, we need to raise at least \$40,000.00-\$50,000.00 plus acquire a reasonably priced, dependable used vehicle for a family of five. We receive no government funding. This is a daunting task, and we are working very hard, but we and the family need your help and prayers.

This weekend, raffle baskets will be displayed in the Memorare Center after the Masses on March 2nd and 3rd. Stop by to see the prizes and buy your tickets. The proceeds will go to the Hapii family's needs. The raffle will take place at a spaghetti dinner at St. Paul's parish, 1580 Brown Street, Akron, OH 44301 on March 9th from 4:30-7:00 p.m. in Boeke Hall. \$12.00 for adults, \$8.00 for kids 12 and under. The funds raised at this dinner will also support the family.

Next weekend, there will be a second collection for the family during the Masses on March 9th and 10th.

We have set up a GoFundMe page. Go to GoFundMe.com, click the magnifying glass icon to search, type in Akron Ohio for Ukraine, then do NOT click "done", but click on the search tab. Please share the GoFundMe page with all your family and friends—this is very important!





How is your Lenten journey working out for you? Have you noticed the abundance of food items in the Narthex the last two Sundays? Journey with the St. Vincent de Paul Society and share your "abundance" with our neighbors in need. We ask that you simply add one or two items to your grocery cart each week and share with the parish food pantry.

In conjunction with the St. Francis de Sales School and PSR students' Lenten Food Drive, the parish is collecting specific food items over the next two weekends of Lent. You may bring your contributions to church and leave them in the Narthex. This concentrated effort will stock the St. Vincent de Paul Society Food Pantry and aid our neighbors in need.

The purpose of this Lenten Food Drive is to emphasize and reflect on the importance of almsgiving during Lent and to restock the food pantry as the needs of our neighbors have increased. We ask that you simply buy one or two of the suggested items when you do your weekly grocery shopping and think about a person or family you may be helping. For example, as you enjoy a delicious chili dinner some night, pray for the family that you have literally "served" a chili dinner to as well.

To have a well-stocked pantry, the focus will be on items we know are needed. We are suggesting the following schedule so you can plan accordingly:

# March 9-10: canned corn, canned green beans, canned beans

March 16-17: paper goods (toilet paper, paper towels, tissues)

The parish school and PSR families are also participating with items more geared to family dinners and kid-friendly items to make this service project more "real" for the students.

Why are we asking for assistance besides our annual Thanksgiving food collection? Because the need has increased significantly. In 2023, the food pantry gave out 270 bags helping 539 people. The holiday requests for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter, typically average 100 families per holiday. We are currently distributing 8-12 bags a week.
