"The Eucharist is the heart of the Church. Where Eucharistic life flourishes, there the life of the Church will blossom." (St. John Paul II)

St Francis de Sales Parish 70th Anniversary Jubilee

Amongst all of God's saints, one thing that makes St. Francis de Sales stand out is his direct influence on another saint. Months before meeting St. Jane Frances de Chantal, Francis had seen her face in a vision from God, in which He revealed to Francis that he and she would found a new religious Order.

She was listening to one of his Lenten sermons when he recognized her face from his vision. When he asked Archbishop Andre Fremiot who she was, he replied “She is my sister, Madame de Chantal.” The two saints first met at a dinner held by the Archbishop, and their friendship was immediate. The two would exchange letters, and the beauty of Francis de Sales' writing moved Jane to become closer to God with his direction.


Their friendship and mutual love of God led them to found the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary. Though St. Francis preceded St. Jane in death by nineteen years, the two holy friends were reunited at the Church of the Visitation at Annecy, where both saints can still be venerated today.

A new video series titled “Presence” is now available at FORMED. A reflection on stories that caught my attention in the first video follows.

Turn the clock back to 1912 and a church fire in New York Bronx. The Fire Chief has just given up hope of saving the building and has cordoned it off, advising no one to enter. Two priests bolt out of the rectory and, without regards to the warning, charge into the church, returning shortly with the Eucharist cradled in a handkerchief. The Fire Chief interjects, “I hope this wasn't about bread”!

During the Boxer Rebellion of 1900, a young girl witnesses the desecration of a Catholic chapel and 32 consecrated hosts being scattered all about the floor of the church. For the next 32 days she sneaks into the church, spends time in Adoration, and then consumes one host. On the thirty second day, after adoration, consumes the last Eucharist. She was caught and beaten to death.

Either from desecration or by natural calamity, the Lord will not suffer. So why such behavior? The significance of these actions is in the depth of human adoration for the Eucharist. How we respond to either is the degree to which His real presence has consumed us, not us Him. As a Catholic, who am I to dispute such beautiful reflections of love for Jesus in the Eucharist? The young girls' action becomes a cause for bringing Bishop Fulton J. Sheen to daily Eucharistic Adoration.

My intention is to give you a laymen's weekly reflection on each video session.




We have the potential to earn money that really helps our school. If we could get most of our families participating in the program, we could make this our only fundraiser for the school. Won't you please help?
