
SUPER CASH BONANZA RAFFLE TICKETS

HAPII FAMILY WELCOME CIRCLE



This photo is of the Hapii family whom we are bringing to Akron in April as refugees and parolees from Ukraine. Sadly, the family has experienced the horrors of the ongoing war firsthand. We are a Welcome Circle; a group of parishioners from St. Francis de Sales, St. Paul's, and Holy Ghost parishes. Welcome Circles are authorized by the USCCB and the federal government.

As sponsors, our job is to provide housing, household furnishings, furniture, appliances, clothing, internet, food, transportation, household tools, legal aid, English lessons, driver's training, many types of orientation, find employment, and all basic needs of life. This is quite a list, and it will take some time, but our Welcome Circle is 100%

committed to accomplishing all of it! Our goal is to have them self-sufficient within 12 months. The family is eager to work hard to accomplish this.

So far, we have accomplished the following: arranged housing, acquired a full inventory of household goods and furniture, bikes for the family, a washer and dryer, and have raised \$15,000. But to make this all happen successfully, we need to raise at least \$40,000-\$50,000 plus acquire a reasonably priced, dependable used vehicle for a family of five. We receive no government funding. This is a daunting task, and we are working very hard, but we and the family need your help and prayers.

This weekend, there will be a second collection for the family during the Masses on March 9th and 10th. We have set up a GoFundMe page. Go to GoFundMe.com, click the magnifying glass icon to search, type in Akron Ohio for Ukraine, then do NOT click "done," but click on the search tab. Please share the GoFundMe page with all your family and friends – this is very important!

This parish never ceases to amaze us! Between our Sunday collections, the Parish school and PSR families, the St.

Vincent de Paul food pantry is bulging at the seams. Your generosity is overwhelming! Please don't stop! We have one more week of specific items to help our neighbors in need. And it's the basics that are so hard for some to afford. Items like bathroom tissue, tissues and paper towels are what some folks consider "extra." Again, we ask that you simply add one or two items to your grocery cart this next week and leave them in the Narthex next Sunday.

The St. Francis de Sales School and PSR students have been terrific! Their generosity with no incentives shows great hope for our future generation. They simply understand the spirit of "giving."

The purpose of this Lenten food drive is to emphasize and reflect on the importance of almsgiving during Lent and to restock the food pantry as the needs of our neighbors have increased. We ask that you simply buy one or two of the suggested items this week when you do your grocery shopping and think about a person or family you may be helping with basic household items.

To have a well-stocked pantry, the focus will be on items we know are needed. In our final week, we ask for the following:

March 16-17: paper goods (toilet paper, paper towels, tissues)

If it is hard for you to shop, the St. Vincent de Paul Society of our parish always welcomes monetary donations. You can place your donation in an envelope marked SVDP and drop it in the weekly collection basket or place it in the SVDP collection box located in the Narthex by the ushers' room.

Why are we asking for assistance besides our annual Thanksgiving food collection? Because the need has increased significantly. In 2023, the food pantry gave out 270 bags helping 539 people. The holiday requests for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter, typically average over 100 families per holiday. We are currently distributing 8-12 bags a week.

Here is a real case scenario to think about:

J. lives in subsidized housing, has a disabled son and does not have a car. A St. Vincent de Paul member takes groceries there every 2 weeks.

Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord, and he will repay him for his deed. Proverbs 19:17

The Stephen Ministry Team continues to pray for all of the requests that have been submitted in the prayer box located at the back of the church. Please know that all of these prayer requests continue to be in






